covered in rodeo queening. I have been reviewing many different aspects of horsemanship, as well as learning the changes that have occurred within the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association. I have kept up on current events and I practice answering different questions regarding those different issues.

Public Speaking comes very easily to me but I believe that practicing is the only way to improve oneself so I have set up numerous different venues where I will present my Miss Rodeo America speech.

Another aspect of being a rodeo queen is the wardrobe that is required for Miss Rodeo America. I have about 25 different outfits that I will be wearing during the pageant. Miss Rodeo Wyoming 2009 Results

Allie Bass, the Sheridan WYO Rodeo Queen, from Sheridan, took home the honors of Miss Rodeo Wyoming 2009. The Miss Rodeo Wyoming pageant was held in Douglas, WY August 12-16, 2008 during the Wyoming State Fair. There were 7 young women vying for the title of Miss Rodeo Wyoming 2009 from across the state. Contestants included Allie Bass as the Sheridan WYO Rodeo Queen from Sheridan; Beth Wood as Miss Laramie Jubilee from Laramie; Bradi Nelson as Miss All Around from Cheyenne; Hailey Kogaines as Sublette County Rodeo Queen from Pinedale; Shannon King as Pinebluffs Rodeo Queen from Cheyenne; Erin Heffron as Miss Teton County Fair & Rodeo Queen from Jackson; and Emily Delyea as Miss Converse County Cowbelles from Douglas. The contestants were judged by a panel of three highly qualified judges including Lolly Klug of NE, Sandy Garrett of SD, and Rich Lunde of UT.

Stacy Jo Johnson, Miss Rodeo Wyoming 2008, crowned Allie Bass, the Sheridan WYO Rodeo Queen of Sheridan, as Miss Rodeo Wyoming 2009. The Wyoming State Fair Director, James Goodrich, and the Dept of Ag Director, John Etchepare, were on hand to present the saddle to Allie. Allie took home the categories of horsemanship, personality, and won the knowledge award.

The first runner-up went to Erin Heffron, the Teton County Fair & Rodeo Queen of Jackson. Erin also won the categories of appearance and scrapbook.

The second runner-up went to Emily Delyea, Converse County Cowbelles Queen of Douglas.

Bradi Nelson, Miss All Around of Cheyenne, won the categories of photogenic and speech.

Beth Wood, Miss Laramie Jubilee of Laramie, won the honors of Miss Congeniality.

Meet Allie

Allie Bass of Sheridan was named Miss Rodeo Wyoming 2009 at the Miss Rodeo Wyoming Pageant in Douglas during the Wyoming state fair in August. She won the crown by capturing high scores in the categories of horsemanship, personality, and knowledge. Wyoming State Fair Director James Goodrich and Department of Agriculture Director John Etchepare presented Bass with a Courts saddle tooled with the Miss Rodeo Wyoming title.

Allie is the daughter of Bill and Lois Bass of Sheridan. Her love of horses, agriculture, and the outdoors started early; she has been in the saddle since she was 4 years old. Her participation in 4-H gave her many opportunities to hone her skills as a rider and horse trainer. Allie's interest in agriculture was a natural fit with FFA, where she served as a chapter officer and member of the horse judging team. She received many awards and honors in both programs including 4-H state champion individual horse judge, 12 state champion

equestrian awards, FFA equine proficiency honors, and the Star Chapter Farmer Award.

Allie has always been a fierce competitor in both academic and extracurricular activities. She was a member of National Honor Society, lettered in soccer, swimming, FFA and competed on the Sheridan High School Rodeo Team. In 2008, she was the Sheridan WYO-Rodeo Queen. Through these experiences, she has learned that hard work, dedication, good sportsmanship and a positive attitude are the keys to success in any undertaking.

Allie is currently attending Casper College and plans to graduate with a degree in Engineering and Mathematics and will then transfer to the University of Wyoming to pursue a Bachelor's degree in agricultural engineering. When not in school or on horseback, Allie enjoys hunting, fishing, and traveling.

Allie is thrilled with the opportunity to fulfill the 2009 Miss Rodeo Wyoming duties to educate the public, promote the sport of rodeo, and serve as an ambassador for the western way of life Wyoming offers.











Road Report
